Relative clauses can either be restrictive or non-restrictive. 1. Restrictive Relative Clauses: A restrictive relative clause is essential in order to complete the meaning of the main clause.

A nonrestrictive clause is a subordinate clause that may be left out of a sentence without significantly altering the meaning expressed by the main clause. A restrictive clause provides information that is pertinent or essential to the meaning of the sentence. A non-restrictive clause , also called a parenthetical or an appositive , contains information that is extra.
